Women must be the target market so we reach the whole family

Every Rural Haitian Experiences The Quality Of Life Associated With Extreme Poverty

- At least 50% of the population has no access to health services.
- At least 70% of the population has no access to clean drinking water.
- 56% of the population is malnourished.
- The infant mortality rate is 76 deaths per 1,000 live births.
- Life expectancy at birth is less than 50 years.
- The illiteracy rate is greater than 50%, the highest in the Americas.

P O V E R T Y ?



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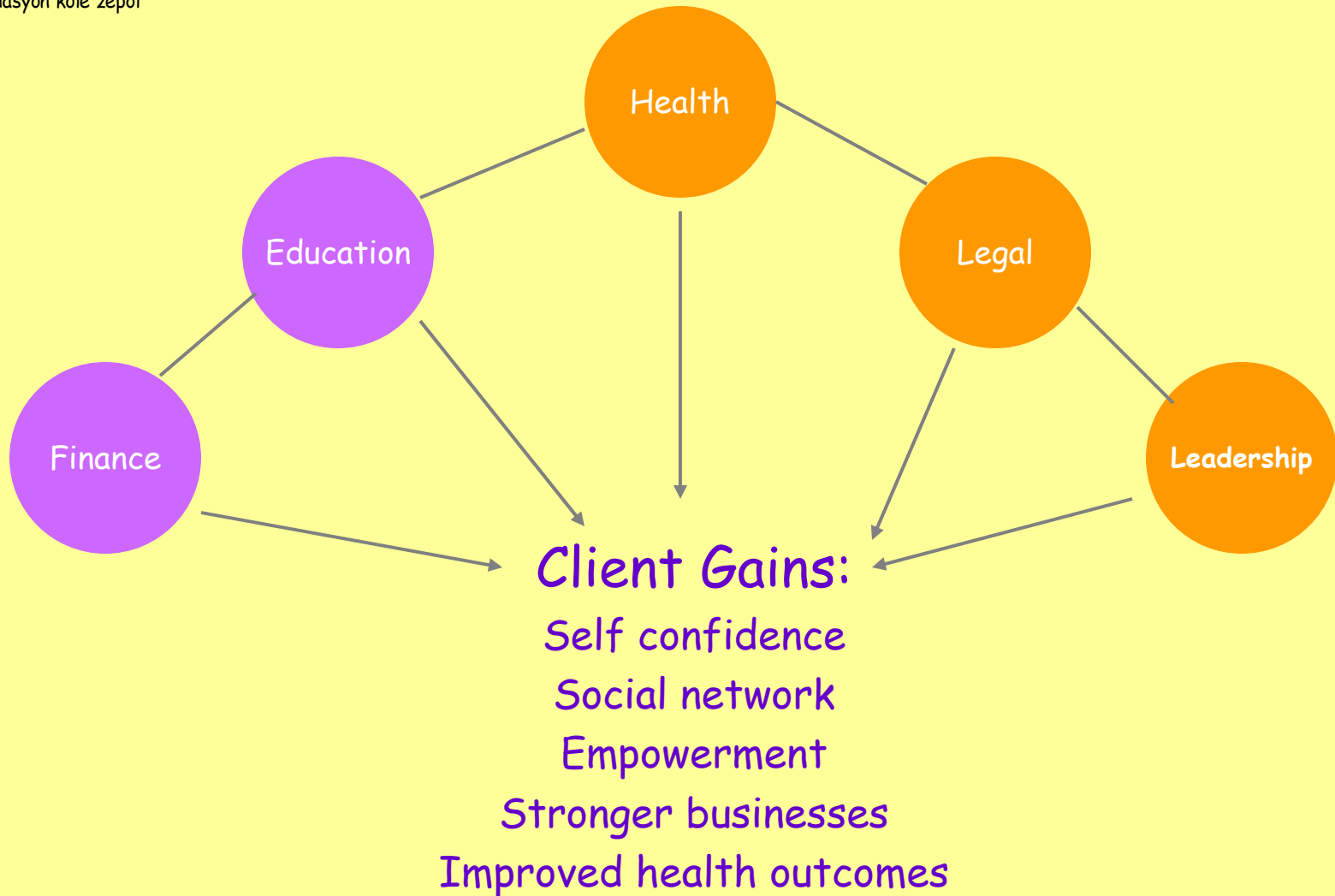

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A Model of Integrated Services



Three Levels Of Poverty

1. Economically Active Poor:

- ✓ Ready and able to work
- ✓ Not yet leveraged their businesses to achieve a decent income
- ✓ Ready to respond to financial services, technical assistance, and education

2. Hard Core Poor:

- ✓ Consumed by day-to-day survival
- ✓ If their survival needs are met, they can enter into a development period and secure a path to independence



Three Levels Of Poverty

(continued)

3. Ultra-Poor:

- ✓ Do not see economic and social success as a possibility in their lives.
- ✓ See their situation as permanent, perhaps ordained.
- ✓ Requires breakthroughs in the way people think and often in the culture surrounding them.



If We Want To Reach Deeper

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- Credit is not enough
- Credit with savings is not enough
- Credit with literacy training is not enough
- Credit with business and health promotion education is not enough





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Who/What Is Zanmi Lasante?

- Sister organization in Haiti of Partners In Health
- Mission: To provide a preferential option for the poor by bringing the benefits of modern medical science to those most in need and by serving as an antidote to despair
- Founder and Medical Director: Dr. Paul Farmer, physician, Harvard professor, renowned infectious- disease specialist, anthropologist, recipient of MacArthur "genius" grant
- Grew from 2-room clinic in late 1980s to full-service, 104-bed hospital, TB & AIDS inpatient treatment facility, Women's Health Center, 4 community based clinics, and a dozen schools
